2020 BOTSWANA GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION (BGCSE) EXAMINATION RESULTS ARE RELEASED

Botswana Examinations Council (BEC) has released the **2020** Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education (BGCSE) examination results. A total of **36 557** candidates wrote the 2020 examination showing a small increase in candidature compared to the **2019** cohort of **36 508**. There were **15 297 (41.84%)** male candidates and **21 260 (58.16%)** female candidates.

The grades available at this level are on a scale of A* to G, where A* represents the highest level of performance and G the lowest level of performance. Candidates failing to reach the minimum requirement for Grade G are ungraded and assigned letter U, and those failing to satisfy the requirements for grading in a syllabus are assigned letter X.

Since the BGCSE is a syllabus-based qualification with no aggregation, the measure used to gauge the performance of candidates at system level is the proportion of candidates who are awarded Grade G or better, Grade E or better and Grade C or better in the best **six** (6) syllabuses.

For government schools, this year the proportion of candidates obtaining Grade G or better in 6 syllabuses is 96.39% compared to 97.64% in 2019, while the proportion of candidates obtaining Grade E or better is 65.36% compared to 64.87% in 2019. At credit grades (C or better), the proportion of candidates is 21.17% compared to 20.95% in 2019. Performance shows a slight increase of 0.22% at Grade C or better, at Grade E or better performance shows a slight increase of 0.49% whereas Grade G or better shows a slight decline of 1.25%. Thus the results show that that the overall performance has declined insignificantly by 1.25% but the quality of the results is slightly better than that of 2019 as shown by insignificant improvements at grade E or better and C or better.

The results show that females outperformed their male counterparts at G or better, Grade

E or better and Grade C or better. However, at grade A or better, males outperformed their female counterparts, overall.

BEC recognises Outstanding Performance of candidates as Top Achievers. The criterion for outstanding performance in the BGCSE examination is achievement of at least six (6) A*s in eight (8) of the syllabuses that a candidate may have taken. The prospective number of candidates who met this criterion in 2020 is nineteen (19) from twelve (12) centres compared to eleven (11) from seven (7) centres in 2019, with four (4) candidates from one centre this year whilst the rest of the centres had two (2) or one (1).

The top candidate achieved 11A* from 11 syllabuses in 2020 which was far better than in 2019 when the top candidate achieved 8A*, 1A and 1B from a total of 10 syllabuses. In 2018 the achievement was at 8A*, 2A and 1B from 11 syllabuses. It is noted that the top two (2) candidates achieved the highest level of performance in the history of the BGCSE.

Symbols used in the Results

U denotes that a candidate failed to meet minimum requirements for Grade G.

X denotes that a candidate failed to meet the requirements for the award of a syllabus grade.

The distribution of the results will be done as follows:

- 1. **Individual Candidates**: Candidates will be able to access the results through the BEC Website as well as through SMS.
- 2. **Distribution to Centres**: Centres will be granted access to view and print the results reports through the Malepa application.
- 3. **Distribution to Regional Offices**: The Regional and Sub-Regional Heads will be able to access the results reports through Malepa.

Candidates are informed that Statement of Results can be collected at designated locations across the country during working hours as follows:

- 1. All **government and private schools candidates** should collect their Statements of Results from their respective schools as these will be printed by individual schools directly from Malepa Application.
- 2. All **individual private candidates** should collect their Statements of Results from the following locations:
