The main idea of the annual Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) inspections is to maintain international examination standards based on the accreditation agreement between BEC and CIE, says Mrs. Dorcus Morake

In her welcoming remarks during the meeting with the CIE Inspector Ms Marion June Cannie on Monday, 27th October 2014, the Director of Examinations Administration and Certification (EAC) pointed out that the annual inspections ensure that examinations are secure and are in accordance with the accreditation agreement.

Mrs. Morake stated that the 2012/2013 CIE inspections report was shared with stakeholders like the Ministry of Education and Skills Development (MoESD) as the latter owns schools, adding that BEC utilises such reports to make corrective actions.
