

2014 PROVISIONAL SUMMARY OF RESULTS



Examination Administration

- BGCSE examination was written from 6th October to 14th November 2014.
- Invigilation was carried out by practicing teachers.
- BEC employed 12 Regional Examination Administrators to monitor the conduct of examinations by carrying out spot checks and inspections during the examination period.



- Coursework moderation took place between August and December 2014.
- Marking of the examinations was done from the 1st to 24th December, 2014.

Syllabi and Components

- A total of twenty-eight (28) Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education (BGCSE) localised syllabi and three (3) syllabi borrowed from Cambridge International Examinations were examined.
- One (1) of the CIE syllabi (French) an International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) syllabus.



 Two (2) of the CIE syllabi (Statistics and Additional Mathematics) were General Certificate of Education (GCE) O-Level syllabi.

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Syllabi and Components

- BGCSE assessment is a combination of written examinations, practical examinations and coursework assessment totaling 78 papers.
- There were 49 written components, 8 multiple-choice papers, 13 coursework components and 8 practical examinations.



 All processing of the BGCSE syllabi was done locally with the Malepa application.

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> The borrowed syllabi were marked, graded and results processed by CIE.

Special Needs Candidates

- For the 2014 BGCSE there were 250 Special Needs candidates as compared to 156 in 2013 and 112 in 2012. Access arrangements and special considerations were considered for them case by case.
- Increase in the numbers could be attribute to a higher level of awareness and ability to identify special needs by schools



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Grading

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scale ranging from A* to G.

- BGCSE examination is graded by subjects experts at BEC and Principal Examiners from schools and colleges.
- The grading is validated by a Grade Advisory Committee which is comprised of BEC experts, a representative from Cambridge International Examinations (CIE), a representative from Curriculum Development and Evaluation, a representative from the Department of Inspectorate and one member from Botswana College of Distance and Open Learning (BOCODOL).

- Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade G are awarded grade U, however the grade U is not reported in the certificate. It only appears in the statement of results.

Performance by candidates at subject level is graded on an eight-point

 Candidates for 0569 Science Double Award are awarded two grades (for example A*A*, AA, BB etc.).

Outcome at Syllabus Level

- 2014 results generally show a decline compared to 2013 measured by proportion of candidates obtaining grade C or better due to weaknesses displayed by candidates across the various syllabi.
- Five syllabi, Science Double Award, Art & Design and Physical Education, French and Statistics show significant improvements.
- Fourteen syllabi show a decline; these include Setswana, Geography, Development Studies, Religious Education, Food & Nutrition, Home Management, Fashion & Fabrics and Business Studies.



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- The remaining syllabi (10) recorded similar levels of performance in 2013 and 2014.
- The outcome is in line with the teachers' forecasts

Setswana	Cohort have both content and skill deficiency
Math	Candidates displayed weaknesses in the application of Number, Algebra and Geometry
Sci. S/Award	Limited application of scientific skills
History	Limited understanding of historical concepts and distinguishing causes of events
Geography	Candidates weak in extraction and interpretation of information from maps; failed to use basic quantitative techniques
DVS	Candidates failed to apply knowledge of concepts to real life situations; not able to use basic techniques of recording data
Religious Ed.	Candidates weak in high order thinking skills and in displaying knowledge and understanding of religious concepts and facts
F&N	Candidates not able to carry out a variety of food preparation techniques, processes and methods
F&F	Some candidates submitted incomplete products which came in the form of separate pattern pieces
Home Mgt.	Candidates failed to show manipulative skills as evidenced by submitting incomplete products.
Bus. Studies	Limited knowledge and understanding of business concepts, conventions and techniques

Final Outcome


Five schools significantly improved (>2%) in the proportion of candidates awarded 5Cs or better. The schools are Gaborone SSS, Francistown SSS, Shoshong SSS, Masunga SSS, and Nata SSS.



BOTSWANA EXAMINATIONS COUNCIL Eleven (11) schools showed significant decline (>2%) in the proportion of candidates who obtained 5Cs or better. The schools are Good Hope, Mogoditshane, Mmadinare, Ghanzi, Matshekge, Naledi, Moshupa, Lobatse, Shashe, St. Joseph's College, and Moeng College

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


Proportion of Candidates awarded Grade 5C's or Better in Government and Government Aided Schools



St. Joseph's College remains the best performing school with 38.34%. The lowest performing school is Shakawe SSS with 6.99%. The following schools have significantly improved their performance from last year; Mater Spei College, Gaborone SSS, Masunga SSS, Nata SSS, and Francistown SSS.






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The list shows details of performance of the best candidates in the 2014 examinations based on candidates who obtained 6A* or better. This was done based on the best 8 subjects.

Summary

- The total number of candidates increased by 9.73% from 34 069 in 2013 to 37 384 in 2014. The increase is largely attributable to Back-to-School candidates which increased drastically.
- A decrease of 1.07% in the percentage of candidates who were awarded 5Cs or better was observed in 2014 compared to 2013.
- The following schools have significantly improved their performance from last year; Mater Spei College, Gaborone SSS, Masunga SSS, Nata SSS, and Francistown SSS.
- Shashe River School, and Mmadinare SSS experience the greatest decline in performance, other declined schools include, Lobatse SSS, Moshupa SSS, Naledi SSS, Matshekge Hill SSS, and Good Hope SSS.



Shakawe SSS has once again recorded the lowest performance at 6.99%

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
